Registration is requested. Contact the case manager nearest to you to register.

DOCUMENTATION CHECKLIST

To determine eligibility, please bring the following to the orientation:

Social Security Card

Driver's License or Picture ID Card

- Examples: Learner's Permit, Government ID, DMV/State ID card, school ID, etc.

Proof of Citizenship / Right to Work

- Birth Certificate, Passport, Permanent Residence Card (Green Card), Voter's ID or work permit that is valid for at least one year or more.

If male, age 18 or older: Selective Service Registration Confirmation

- Examples: Printout from www.sss.gov, selective service card, or application confirmation letter

Veteran Status (if applicable)

- Examples: DD-214, Report of Transfer or Discharge, Letter from Department of Veteran's Affairs

Public Assistance Verification (if applicable)

- Examples: Notice of Action letter, TANF documents, food stamp notification, EBT card with printed name, etc.

Income Verification

- Proof of the last **6 months** pay for **each** working member of your family that currently lives with you.
- Examples: Paystubs, bank statements, public assistance documents, or unemployment statements are acceptable.

Family Size Verification

- Proof of how many relatives currently live with you.
- Examples: Most recent tax return, lease, or public assistance letter with family members listed; and/or birth records of dependents.

School Records

- Submit your most recent diploma, transcripts and/or report card, and Individual Educational Plan (IEP) as applicable.

Challenges: Homeless, Foster Care, Runaway, Pregnant/Parenting, Offender, School Drop-Out, Basic Skills Deficient, Disabled, English Language Learner

- (Assessments may be provided to determine eligibility in this area if needed).
- Proof of any of these challenges that you have encountered.
